### Academy of Mount St. Ursula

Celebrating 160 years in 2015, the Academy of Mount St. Ursula is a girls’ school founded in 1855 by the Ursuline Sisters.

Students can take Advanced Placement courses in European history, American history, Spanish, English, biology and calculus. Juniors and seniors are eligible to take college level courses through a partnership with St. John’s University and Mercy College.

All Hallows is a boys’ school founded in 1909 by the Irish Christian Brothers.
