Albertus Magnus, Bardonia

Albertus Magnus, a co-educational school, was founded by the Dominican Sisters of Sparkill in 1957.

Advanced Placement courses are available. College credit is available through a partnership with St. Thomas Aquinas College in Sparkill.

There are more than 50 activities for students, including mock trial, and clubs for drama, computers and pro-life.

Known for its theatre program, the school produces two musicals each year.

Faculty and students use iPads, SMART Boards, ExamSoft and the Black Board Online Learning Management System.

Kennedy's 60-acre campus is the home of boys and girls championship varsity sports. The sports program includes basketball, lacrosse, track, ice hockey, cross country, field hockey, football, soccer, swimming, tennis, volleyball, baseball and golf.

It was the sixth time the academy was named to the honor roll. It was also named one of the Top 20 schools in New York by the website Niche.com in 2015.

The curriculum includes courses in Latin, Greek, modern languages, astronomy, Great Books literature, logic, debate, philosophy, chivalry, Christian womanhood, art and music history.
